Visitor Guidance

ALL VISITS MUST BE SCHEDULED IN ADVANCE WITH OUR RECEPTIONIST!

❖ **Welcome – Thanks for coming!!**

We are so thrilled to have you here! It has likely been awhile since you have been in our home, so you will notice a few things are different since you have been here last. Although we would love to welcome you with no conditions, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, that option is just not available to us at this time.

❖ **Did You Know?**

- If you are under 30 years of age – lucky you! But.... Did you know that the people you are visiting are 630 times more likely to die from COVID-19 than you are?!?
- Less than 1% of America's population lives in long-term care facilities, but as of January 28, 2021, this tiny fraction of the country accounts for 36% of US COVID-19 deaths.
- Because you are visiting, we know you care about your loved one. The following information is how we can help you protect him/her from getting sick.

❖ **Arrival**

- We will allow you to answer all sorts of lovely details about your health condition at our front door kiosk to ensure you don't have symptoms of COVID-19. You should know any one of these can indicate COVID-19, so you won't be allowed a visit if you have any of these symptoms:

Fever of over 100.0	Cough	Sore Throat
Chills or shaking with chills	Muscle or body aches	Headache
Loss of taste or smell	Congestion or runny nose	Fatigue
Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea	Respiratory symptoms or shortness of breath	

- Pump some of our life-saving sanitizer on your hands and rub it in!
- Grab a fresh mask – bend it to fit over the bridge of your nose and stretch to fit below your chin.
Please keep your nose and mouth covered during your entire visit.

❖ **During Your Visit**

- We will provide a visiting area (typically your loved one's room) that will allow you to keep your distance - **6 feet** is the magic number – it's the new social etiquette!
- Press our sanitizer pumps to refresh your hands after touching surfaces or coughing/sneezing.
- Feel free to utilize our public bathrooms, but don't forget to sing "Happy Birthday" twice while scrubbing bubbles in your hands!
- Food is always a welcome gift, but please don't remove your mask to partake.

❖ **Come back soon!**

- Your loved one needs to see you! PLEASE follow these simple rules so we don't have to be in that awkward position of banning you from visiting our campus.
- If you like our hand sanitizers as much as we do, feel free to give it one last pump on your way out the door to protect yourself and your family so you can come back and see us again soon!
